Application Checklist

- Complete all questions, sign, and submit the application by the appropriate deadline noted above.
- Enclose a non-refundable \$45 check or money order payable to UNCG through a U.S. bank for the application fee, or provide a credit card number (Mastercard or VISA card). Do not send cash. Include your full name on your check. Applications received without the fee enclosed will not be processed. Application fees are not refundable.
- Submit official academic records in sealed envelopes from each secondary school (all four years, plus examinations), college, technical/vocational, or university you have attended. Academic records must be submitted in the native language with a professional English translation. All records must bear the original stamp or seal of the institution with the signature of a school official.
- Applicants whose official native language is not English must prove English proficiency by one of the following means: TOEFL, IELTS, or SAT verbal test. (See question #18 for details.)
 - Conditional Admission:** UNCG offers conditional admission to academically eligible students who have not met the English proficiency requirement. Conditionally admitted students first enroll in the INTERLINK Language Center at UNCG to improve their English language skills. Upon successful completion of INTERLINK, applicants are fully admitted to UNCG. Students who successfully complete INTERLINK are NOT required to take the TOEFL, IELTS, or SAT test.
